## Preamble

IGF Benin has been organised every year since 2012. This is a national platform for discussion on issues related to Internet governance. This initiative stems from a recommendation formulated in 2006 by the United Nations, following the World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS) in Tunis in 2005. This national meeting brings together key actors of the digital ecosystem: **public administration, civil society, private sector, academic community, technical community, media, and government.**

For the year 2025, the global theme of the IGF (IGF World), **"Building together the digital governance"**, focuses on trust, inclusion, cooperation and responsible innovation. At the national level, IGF Benin has chosen to adapt this global orientation to the country's realities by centering discussions on:

**"Digital citizenship and inclusion: participating, protecting oneself and empowering oneself in the Beninese digital space".**

This theme highlights three essential dimensions:

- Participate: guarantee equitable access and citizen participation in the digital space
- Protect oneself: secure usage, protect rights, fight against abuses.
- Empower oneself: strengthen skills, digital education and the capacity for action of all.

This theme addresses Benin's current challenges: digital divide persistent, rise of digital usage, growing needs for digital skills, security issues, influence of digital on citizen participation and the need to strengthen digital sovereignty.

## 1- Context and justification

Benin is in full digital expansion, with rapid growth in access to the Internet and especially social networks. However, most of this digital expansion brings challenges, particularly regarding ethics, online security, personal data protection and digital inclusion. It is essential to promote responsible and inclusive digital citizenship to ensure that all Beninese citizens can benefit from the opportunities offered by digital technology. Because many are ignorant of the rights, responsibilities and practices related to internet usage and often fall under the laws sanctioning digital offenses, as well as the numerous opportunities associated with it.

This year's theme aims to equip the Beninese citizen on all the legal texts governing the Beninese digital space, to lift the veil on the inherent traps in order to guard against sanctions related to the violation of digital principles in Benin.

## 2- Objectives

The general objective of this forum is to allow the creation of an inclusive and multi-stakeholder space to analyze, debate and co-construct paths of action to promote responsible, inclusive and secure digital citizenship in Benin.

### Specifics

- 1- Foster a national dialogue on the current dynamics of the digital ecosystem.
- 2- Identify priority issues for a citizen-oriented, secure and inclusive use of the Internet.
- 3- Produce recommendations adapted to the national context, accompanied by synthetic materials intended for the general public (infographics, awareness sheets, accessible summaries).
- 4- Strengthen the capacities of local actors, with a particular focus on digital literacy, key to empowerment.

- 5- Stimulate the participation of youth, women, vulnerable populations and local communities in regional and international initiatives (IGF Africa, IGF World).
- 6- Encourage collaboration between public, private, and community actors.

### 3- Reminder of Expected Results

At the end of the forum, the following results are expected:

- Rich and structured multi-stakeholder exchanges.
- A reinforced understanding of the challenges of digital citizenship in Benin.
- A set of national recommendations to improve inclusion, protection, and citizen participation online.
- A roadmap or paths of action for stakeholders.
- An increased participation of youth, women, vulnerable populations, and local communities.

### 4-The overall process of IGF Benin 2025

Since **2012**, in Benin and every year, the Internet Governance Forum is organized respecting the five principles including **openness and transparency, inclusivity, bottom-up governance, non-commerciality**, and the **approach multi-stakeholder**. The process in general took place in three main phases: **the preparatory phase, the holding of the Forum itself, and the post-forum phase**.

All the tasks of this process were executed by sub-committees under the supervision of the elected chair of the multi-stakeholder advisory group, MAG, **Turibio Mahuvivi KEKE**.

## ● The preparatory phase

The preparatory phase began on **September 24**, 2025 with the establishment of the MAG and the creation of discussion forums open to all via a call for applications. It is important to remember that the MAG is composed of volunteers from various stakeholder groups (public sector, private sector, civil society, technical community, international organization, etc.). The MAG members were divided into four thematic sub-committees, each having a WhatsApp forum to discuss and accomplish their tasks. The sub-committees created are as follows:

- Drafting and Monitoring Committee
- Public Relations & Partnerships Committee
- Communication Committee
- Logistics Committee

Each of the coordinators of these sub-committees met in the coordination sub-committee to support the MAG chair and vice-chair in the successful organization of the event.

The activities of this preparatory phase consisted of:

- Drafting various terms of reference (TOR)
- Searching for sponsors
- Creating communication visuals
- Drafting and distributing physical and electronic mail
- Following up on sent mail
- Preparing and testing technical equipment
- Resolving transmission issues for online participants
- The production of attendance lists and the mailing list
- The preparation of the draft final communiqué and thank-you letters
- The management of emails, phone calls, and social media
- The negotiation of a venue to host the Forum
- Negotiations with service providers, etc.

These activities are transversal to several preparatory meetings online and in person, the goal of which is to evaluate the progress made, the difficulties encountered, the challenges and constraints, and to consider perspectives for resolving them. A report was produced after each of these meetings.

## ● The Forum

The proceedings of the Forum were conducted on Saturday, December 13, 2025, under three angles, the first of which is the opening ceremony, then the conduct of the sessions, and the final communique.

### → The opening ceremony

The opening ceremony was marked by a single intervention which is nothing other than that of the Chair of the MAG.



The Chair of the Multistakeholder Advisory Group (MAG 2025), Mr. **Turibio Mahuvivi KEKE** officially opened the 14th edition of the forum on Internet governance (IGF) in Benin by wishing a welcome to the participants present and to those following the proceedings online, while saluting their commitment to the issues of digital governance. He recalls that since 2012, the IGF Benin constitutes a national multi-stakeholder dialogue space bringing together **public actors**, the

**private sector, civil society, the academic world, the technical community** and the **media**, in the **spirit of the United Nations World Forum**. For this edition, the MAG worked on developing an inclusive and balanced program, aligned with national priorities and the global theme "**Building digital governance together**". The theme chosen at the national level, "**Digital citizenship and inclusion: participating, protecting oneself and empowering oneself in the Beninese digital space**",

highlights the importance of citizen participation in the digital era, the need to guard against risks related to cyber threats, disinformation and rights violations, as well as the challenge of empowerment through equitable access, digital skills and literacy. The speech also highlighted the role of MAG as a facilitator of dialogue and guarantor of the diversity of voices, without replacing the actors, and specifies that the panels and sessions will notably address digital inclusion, citizen participation, protection of rights, digital security and sovereignty, with the objective of formulating concrete recommendations adapted to the Beninese context. Finally the president invited the participants to take an active part in the discussions, thanks the members of the MAG, the organizing committee, the partners all the contributors, and declared the work of the **14th edition** of the forum on Internet governance in Benin officially open.

## → Conduct of the sessions

The forum took place in a hybrid mode, combining in-person participation and online exchanges. Following a multi-stakeholder approach, the sessions were structured around keynote presentations and discussion panels led by experts, academics and representatives of the civil society. Each session aimed to diagnose current challenges and propose strategic recommendations for the country's digital development.

## Keynote: Digital citizenship, rights and protection

**Speaker: Mr. Jean-Yves AHOUANVOEDO**



This session highlighted the "Beninese digital paradox": a massive adoption of digital tools by the population despite a generally low level of technical and critical mastery. The talk structured the challenges around the "digital triangle":

- **Digital freedoms:** A fragile achievement in the face of surveillance and disinformation.

- **Digital security:** An urgency for data protection and infrastructure resilience.
- **Digital sovereignty:** Benin's capacity to steer its own technological development.

The speaker called for the creation of a "Beninese digital pact" to define reciprocal commitments between the State, the private sector and citizens.

## High-Level Panel: Digital citizenship and inclusion

**Moderator:** Emmanuel CODJO

**Panelists:** Elias GNANCADJA, KEKE Turibio and AMBARKA Rahamane.



The panel defined digital citizenship as the ability to use tools in a responsible, secure and inclusive manner.

The discussions highlighted that while digital technology strengthens citizen expression, it also exposes users to risks of cybercrime and hate speech.

### Key points:

- **Inclusion:** Necessity to reduce disparities related to gender, age and geography to ensure equitable participation.
- **Empowerment:** Investing in the training of youth and women is seen as a lever for inclusive development.

## Panel 1 : Digital Inclusion : Connecting, Training, and Empowering

**Moderator:** Jeudida KPATI.

**Panelists :** Clara GNINOU, Elias GNANCADJA, Harold ADJAHO et Jean-Yves AHOUANVOEDO.



This panel identified the "digital divide" as the major obstacle, limiting access to online services for marginalized populations and SMEs.

Strategic recommendations:

- Open Classrooms, while ensuring effective connectivity.
- Partnerships: Collaborate with actors like AWS or use social
- networks (LinkedIn, Facebook) to disseminate training opportunities

## Panel 2: Citizen participation in the digital age

**Moderator:** Emmanuel CODJO

**Panelists:** Bakary KOUYATE, Harold ADJAHO and Yao Amévi SOSSOU

Digital technology transforms the relationships between citizens and public authorities by facilitating dialogue and transparency.

## Observations and challenges:

- **Accountability:** Digital platforms allow for monitoring public action and holding leaders accountable.
- **Local engagement:** It is crucial to implement tools at the level of local communities to collect the opinions of the populations.
- **Real impact:** The panelists insisted that participation must not be symbolic; citizen contributions must truly influence public policies.
- **Regional reference:** The experience of Mali was cited to illustrate the persistent challenges of trust and access to infrastructure.

All the work highlights that the digital development of Benin relies on a balance between **active participation, protection of rights and citizen empowerment**. The success of this transformation requires concerted action and shared responsibility between the State, civil society and the private sector in order to build a secure and sovereign digital ecosystem.

Ensuring the smooth running and timing by managing the welcome, facilitation, coordination of speakers and adherence to protocol, while creating an atmosphere and managing unforeseen events with empathy and organization. **Hymogene DOSSOU** was the central point of contact, guiding participants, managing transitions and ensuring that the organizers' wishes were respected in her capacity as Master of Ceremonies.

### ● **The post-session phase**

It is dedicated to drafting the Forum report in the required formats, and to its translation into English.

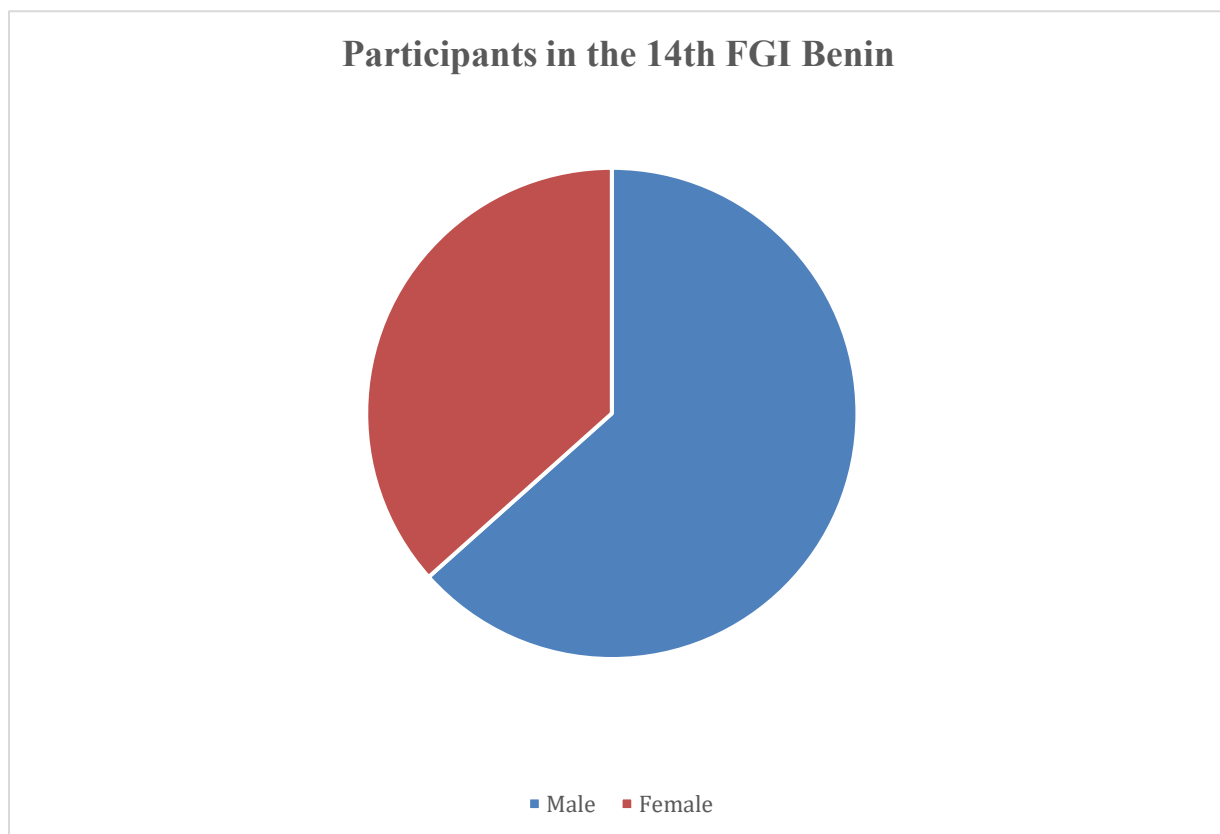
## 5- Results obtained

- Stakeholders were made aware of the importance of ensuring equitable access to the Internet as a fundamental right;
- Commitments from all parties to protect individual rights and to fight against disinformation were strengthened;
- Concrete recommendations were formulated to improve the quality of access to online services.

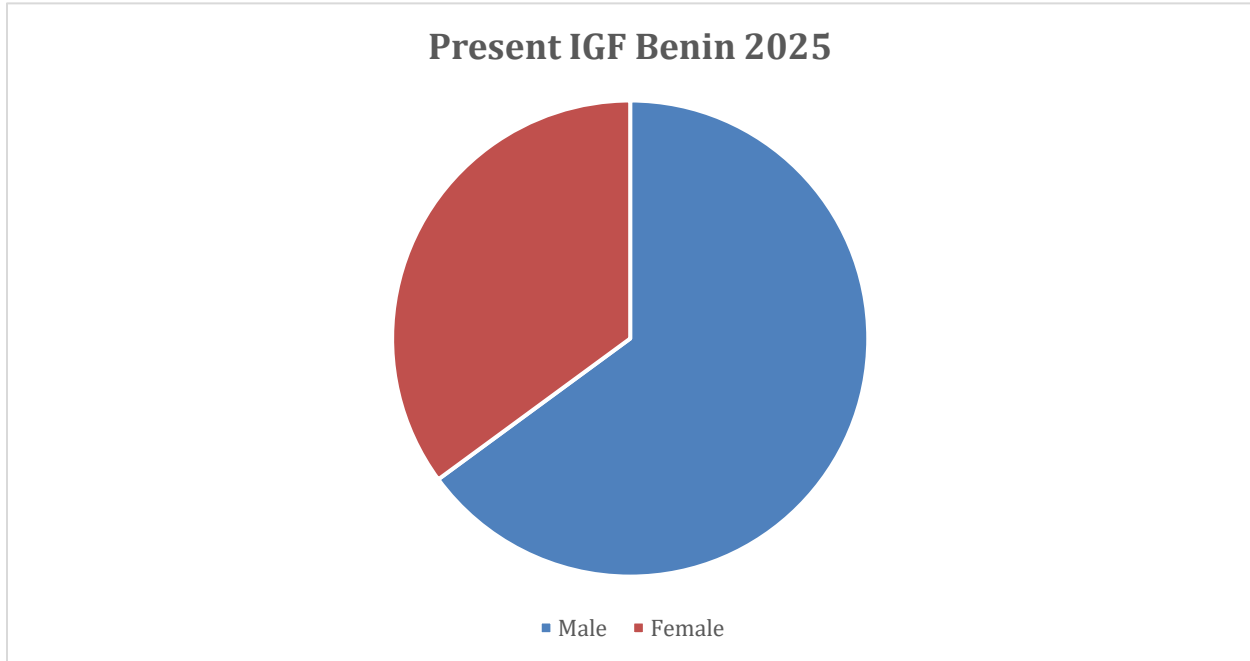
## 6- Participation

The total number of participants registered to attend the 14th IGF Benin is 102, including 74 in person and 28 online.

## 7- Recommendations

At the end of the discussions, recommendations were formulated for various actors: the State, the private sector, the technical community, civil society, the academic world and users.

### • Government

- 1- Accelerate the deployment of connectivity infrastructure, particularly in rural areas and underserved areas, in order to guarantee equitable and inclusive access to the Internet throughout the national territory.
- 2- Strengthen the legal and institutional framework for digital citizenship, by ensuring the effective protection of digital freedoms, privacy and citizens' personal data.
- 3- Consolidate national digital security, in particular by strengthening prevention and response capabilities to cyber threats, the protection of critical infrastructure and the resilience of public information systems.
- 4- Academic World and Technical Community Systematically integrate digital citizenship, data protection and cybersecurity into initial and continuing training programs.
- 5- Encourage applied research on issues of digital freedoms, security and sovereignty, in order to inform public policies.
- 6- Strengthen collaboration between academic, technical, public and private actors for the sharing of knowledge, innovations and best practices.

## • **Private Sector**

- 1- Contribute to expanding access to affordable and quality digital services, especially in disadvantaged areas.
- 2- Develop public-private partnerships fostering training, innovation and digital empowerment of citizens and local businesses.
- 3- Promote responsible and ethical practices in the provision of digital services, particularly regarding data protection and transparency.

## • **Civil Society**

- 1- Intensify awareness-raising actions on digital citizenship, online security, the fight against disinformation and hate speech.
- 2- Conduct targeted digital education campaigns for youth, women, and local communities, taking into account sociocultural realities.
- 3- Strengthen citizen oversight and advocacy for a digital space that respects human rights and is inclusive.
- 4- Promote the digital sovereignty of Benin, by supporting the development of local solutions, the mastery of strategic data and the national capacity to guide technological choices.
- 5- Integrate digital education and training into public policies, placing particular emphasis on young people, women and vulnerable groups, in order to sustainably reduce the digital divide.
- 6- Encourage inclusive and participatory digital governance, involving all stakeholders in the development, implementation, and monitoring of digital public policies.

- **User**

- 1- Adopt responsible and secure behaviors in the use of digital tools and social networks.
- 2- Engage actively in the initiatives of training and self-learning in order to strengthen their autonomy and participation in the digital space.

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
